



Pollination





In open pollination, pollen moves by...

Wind

Insects

Birds or other animals

People







To Maintain Purity, Control Pollination


- Avoid crossing varieties
- Wind pollen: bag the heads.
- Bee pollination: Isolate by distance
- Borders and interruptions
- Physical barriers: Bags, cages, etc.





Tomatoes

- Perfect flowers
- Self pollinated, easy to keep pure



Peppers

- Perfect, self pollinating
- Insect crossing is common
- Isolate or bag/cage





Spinach, Chard, Corn

Wind pollinated

Miles and miles

Bagging is the only way



Beans, Peas, Cowpeas

- Perfect flowers
- Self pollinating
- Crossing is hotly debated
- 25 to 30' enough





Brassica

- Cauliflower, Broccoli, Kohlrabi, Cabbage, etc.
- · All will cross with each other.
- Insect pollination.
- Isolate by 1/2 mile.
- Or cage with introduced pollinators.







Radish

- Only crosses with other radishes.
- Just grow one variety and save seeds.







Carrots

- Insect pollinated
- 1/2 mile
- Will cross with Queen Anne's Lace








Squash/Pumpkins

- Separate sexed flowers
- Separate by 1/2 mile
- Hand pollinate
- Cucurbita
 - pepo
 - mixta
 - maxima
 - moschata





C. pepo, aka Yellow Squash

- Zucchini, Yellow, Scallops, many pumpkins
- Acorns, Spaghetti, Delicata










C. moschata – The Butternuts

Hard winter squash and many pumpkins







Technique for Harvesting Seeds



Fermenting Seeds



Day 5 or 6



Top poured off, water filled back up





Poured, filled, poured. Good Seeds Sink.



Spread on a plate to dry





Storing Seeds

- Brown envelopes
- Plastic baggies
- Mason jars
- Room temperature and dry.
