Thornless: 'Apache', 'Arapaho', 'Natchez', 'Ouachita' Thorny: 'Kiowa', 'Rosborough', 'Brazos'

BLUEBERRIES

Powerderblue, Tifblue

PECANS

Early: Apalachee, Caddo, Oconee, Prilop, Lipan Late: Forkert, Kanza, Lakota

PERSIMMON Eureka, Hachiya, 'Tane-nashi', Tamopan,

Eureka, Hachiya, ' Tane-nashi', Tamopan, Izo, Fankio

PLUMS Methley, Santa Rosa, Bruce, Ozark Premiere

NECTARINES Karla Rose, Red gold, Rose Princess, Armking

APRICOT Blenheim, Moorpark, Bryan, Chinese (or Mormon)

SWEET CHERRIES Not recommended for East Texas

SOUR CHERRY

Montmorency

A L M O N D S

Generally not recommended due to repeated crop failure. 'All-in-one' is the only variety

OLIVES

Do not fruit well in East Texas due to temp changes in the Spring

POMEGRANATES

Al-sirin-nar, Russian 18, Salavatski, Spanish Sweet, Sumbar, Surh Anor. Wonderful is a common variety but one of the least cold hardy, so people may ask for it, but it isn't the best one to grow for our area.

MUSCADINE

Self-fertile varieties include: Carlos (a bronze colored grape), Cowart (black), Ison (black), Janebell (bronze), Magnolia (bronze), Noble (red), and Triumph (bronze)

Pollinator required: Darlene (bronze), Fry (bronze), Higgins (black-bronze), Hunt (black), Jumbo (black), Pam (bronze), Scuppernong (bronze), Summit (bronze), and Sweet Jenny (bronze)

CITRUS

Meyer lemon (drought hardy but not always winter hardy), Satsuma (Artic Frost, Orange Frost, Miho)

MAYHAW

Superspur, Superberry, 'Big Red,' 'Winnie Yellow,' 'Highway Red,' 'Highway Yellow,' 'T.O. Warren Superberry,' Angelina, Harrison, Big Mama

WINE GRAPES

Victoria Red, Blanc du Bois, Black Spanish, Herbemont
