



The Texas Master Gardener Program

The Master Gardener program is a volunteer development program of Texas AgriLife Extension. These Master volunteers receive in-depth horticultural training. In return, they provide volunteer service through Extension by delivering horticultural and environmental education and projects to their communities. Program participants should be able to communicate with the public by telephone, personal contact, as a speaker or through written correspondence.

A trainee receives a minimum of 50 hours of instruction and completes an examination to gain the title of "Master Gardener Intern." Inters have one calendar year from course completion to contribute 50 hours of volunteer service in Extension initiated projects in Cherokee County. Participants then become a Certified Texas Master Gardener for 1 year, after which time he/she maintains certification as a Master Gardener through annual service of 18 volunteer hours and each year acquires 6 hours of continuing education. The volunteer aspect of the Master Gardener program allows individuals to dedicate their time and talents to educate, enhance, and beautify their local community utilizing the science and art of horticulture.

2023 MASTER GARDENER CLASS APPLICATION

Classes will be conducted predominately on Tuesdays and Thursdays at the Annex building in Rusk, from approximately 9:00a.m. – 1:00 p.m. Some classes will be in satellite locations such as SFA and Overton. Please see the schedule for details. Classes will begin January 31, 2023 and end approximately April 11 (barring any addition due to weather days.)

A fee of \$125.00 is charged for training materials and is payable in full at the first class meeting (make check payable to Cherokee County Master Gardener Association). NOTE: A background check is required on all applicants participating in the Master Gardeners program. The fee for this service is part of your registration fee.

I would like to serve as a Master Gardener Volunteer in Cherokee County. I understand that Master Gardeners are trained volunteers and community educators, who share their horticultural knowledge and gardening experience with their fellow citizens. In order to complete certification:

- · I will volunteer a minimum of 50 hours in Extension initiated education programs in 2023-24.
- · I will complete the classroom training course including an exam.
- I understand to recertify annually, I must volunteer a minimum of 12 hours in approved Cherokee County Master Gardener Extension initiated programs, plus 6 hours of continuing education.
- · I agree to a background check (required of all Texas AgriLife Extension volunteers)
